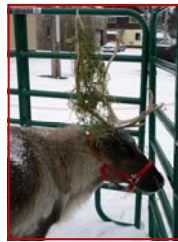

As always we have a few new additions. Jasper is a Great Pyrenees with a wonderful temperament. Great Pyrenees also known as the Pyrenean Mountain Dog are loyal guardians used for guarding livestock. They originate from the

Pyrenean Mountains of France—Males can reach 32" at the shoulder and can weigh up to 125lbs. Since we have added our first Pyrenees "Sampson" to our farm we have not had problems with predators he does a wonderful job of keeping our animals safe.

Our next addition and completely out of the ordinary is Romeo. Romeo is a Mali Uromastix. The Mali Uromastix is native to the deserts of Mali Africa and are fairly new to being domestically raised. The Mali for short, Male can grow up to 16" long and is strictly a herbivore. Because they are a desert animal they need an extremely warm environment. Romeo is very social and highly entertaining.



In March we are going to Alaska: University of Fairbanks Reindeer Research Center. It is going to be a great experience, giving us the opportunity to learn more about our wonderful reindeer.
